

**AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF CAMBODIA
AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA
ON VISA EXEMPTION FOR DIPLOMATIC AND
OFFICIAL/SERVICE PASSPORT HOLDERS**

The Government of the Kingdom of Cambodia and The Government of the Republic of Korea hereinafter referred to as the "Parties",

Desiring to further promoting friendly relations between the two countries and facilitating the travel for the mission of diplomatic and official/service passport holders of the two countries.

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

Nationals of the Kingdom of Cambodia and the Republic of Korea holding valid diplomatic or official/service passports shall be permitted to enter into or exit from the territory of the State of the other Party through their respective international point of entry without visas.

ARTICLE 2

Nationals referred to in Article 1, shall be permitted to enter and stay in the territory of the State of the other Party for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days from the date of entry.

ARTICLE 3

Members of diplomatic missions, consular posts or international organizations, as well as their family members, shall be permitted to enter and stay in the territory of the State of the other Party for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days without necessity of obtaining a visa. Such period of stay shall, upon the request of either Party's diplomatic mission, be extended until the end of their assignment.

ARTICLE 4

1. *The exemption of visa requirements mentioned in Article 1 shall include the exemption of the requirement of an exit permit or transit visa.*
2. *If a national of the State of one Party loses his/her passport in the territory of the State of the other Party, the diplomatic mission shall inform the other Party. When the diplomatic mission issue a fresh passport or travel document, it shall inform the other Party.*

ARTICLE 5

The Parties shall reserve the right to prevent the entry or shorten or terminate the duration of stay of nationals of the State of the other Party if such nationals are considered unacceptable or persona non grata.

ARTICLE 6

The Parties shall proceed to an exchange of their respective valid passport specimens through diplomatic channels within thirty (30) days after the signing of this Agreement. Any Party modifying its passports shall present a specimen of the new passport to the other Party within thirty (30) days prior to its use.

ARTICLE 7

For the reasons of public order, security or health, either Party may temporarily suspend the application of this Agreement in whole or in part. Such suspension shall be notified thirty (30) days in advance to the other Party through diplomatic channels. In emergency case, such suspension shall be notified to the other Party within 72 hours through diplomatic channels.

ARTICLE 8

This Agreement shall enter into force thirty (30) days following its signature. It shall remain in force unless either Party notifies the other Party in writing through diplomatic channels of its intention to suspend or to terminate it. It shall cease to be effective ninety (90) days after the date of notification.

ARTICLE 9

This Agreement may be amended by mutual consent. Any difference or dispute arising out of the implementation of this Agreement shall be settled amicably through consultation or negotiation between the Parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, being duly authorized thereto by their respective Government, have signed this Agreement.

Done at Phnom Penh, on this 20th day of November 2006, in Khmer, Korean and English languages, all texts being equally authentic. In case of any divergence of interpretation, the English text shall prevail.
