1. I'm pleased to be back again in Manila this time to attend the 2^{nd} Meeting of the Joint Commission for Bilateral Cooperation (JCBC) between Cambodia and the Philippines. On behalf of the Cambodian delegation and myself, let me thank H.E. Secretary Alan Peter Cayetano and the Department of Foreign Affairs of the Philippines for the warm hospitality extended to us as well as for the excellent arrangements of this meeting.

2. I'm glad to tell you that this is my fifth time here in your beautiful country, following my previous visits to attend various ASEAN-related meetings. I'm sure you can appreciate my commitment to work with you on both bilateral to multilateral settings to promote peace and stability in the region as well as to seek collaborative ways to enhance prosperity for our peoples.

3. This year is particularly special for Cambodia and the Philippines as we mark a double celebration: the 60th anniversary of our diplomatic relations and the 50th anniversary of the founding of ASEAN. As our ASEAN

Community become more and more integrated, with additional milestones achieved this year thanks to some extent by the Philippines's chairmanship, we have to recognize that both bilateral and multilateral tracks are closely intertwined and cannot be separated from one another.

As such, the outcomes of today's JCBC should be seen 4. from that complementarity perspective. The positive achievements in our bilateral cooperation will, no doubt, contribute to the strengthening of our ASEAN Community. If you recall the 1st JCBC which was held 6 years ago, it was cochaired only by our deputy foreign ministers. That's why I am pleased that this 2nd JCBC is co-chaired by Secretary Cayetano and myself. This is a clear testimony of our common commitment to enhance and strengthen this bilateral cooperation mechanism. On this matter, I agree with Secretary Cayetano's view that intra-ASEAN relations and cooperation are as important as the ones with our outside partners.
